

Sister vs. sister in college lacrosse action

Plus a Harford star scores her 100th goal while sticking for Syracuse Orange

It was a big weekend for a handful of local girls lacrosse players who are playing big-time college lacrosse for three of the nation's top women's lacrosse programs.

On Sunday, sisters met on opposite sides of the field as Northwestern University junior Casey Donohoe and University of North Carolina freshman Corey Donohoe faced each other down for the first time as collegiate adversaries at Northwestern.

The elder Donohoe, Casey, a midfielder for Northwestern, and her Wildcat teammates won this battle, 16-3, over the Tarheels and the younger Donohoe, Corey, a attack for North Carolina.

Casey finished the day with three goals in Northwestern's lopsided win, while Corey finished with one goal for North Carolina.

The pair did score back-to-back goals in the opening minutes of the second half.

Casey's second of three goals came at the 24:56 mark for a 9-0 Wildcats lead, while Corey countered for the Tarheels at 22:24 for her team's first goal.

On Saturday, Syracuse made a visit to Loyola where the Gibson sisters of Jarrettsville faced off and Bel Air's Christina Dove reached a milestone.

Dove, a sophomore midfielder, recorded three goals in the Orange's 19-8 win. Dove's third goal of the game with 2:18 remaining in the

contest and was the 100th of her college career. Dove is just the seventh player in Syracuse history to score 100 or more career goals.

Christina Gibson is a senior defender for Syracuse and her sister Emily Gibson is a sophomore midfielder and her other sister, Johanna Gibson, is a freshman defender at Loyola.

Emily Gibson recorded an assist for Loyola.
